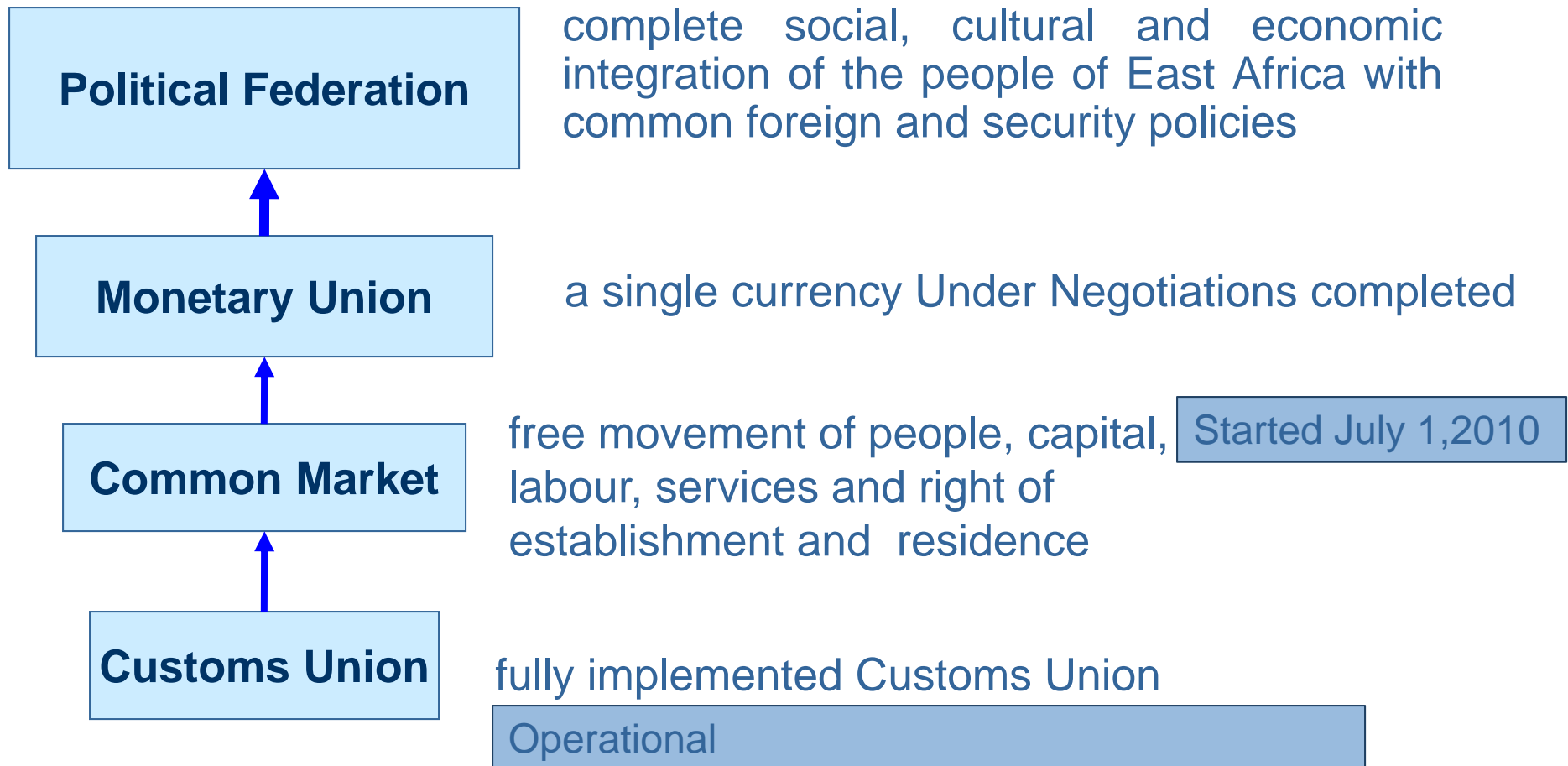
STRUCTURE OF THE COMMUNITY

Existing Framework

- Regional Strategy on Scaling Up Access to Modern Energy Services and 5 year implementation action plan
- Regional Cross Border Electrification Policy
- Regional Power Master Plan
- Climate Change Policy and Plan



Regional strategy on scaling up access to modern energy services

Targets;

- Provide access to modern cooking practices for 50% of the population that currently uses traditional cooking fuel;
- Provide access to reliable electricity for all urban and peri-urban poor;
- Provide access to modern energy services for all schools, clinics, hospitals and community centres
- Provide access to mechanical power for productive uses for all communities



Key Areas of Cooperation with EACREEE

- Policy Formulation and harmonization at regional and national level;
- Capacity building of both public and private sector actors to implement RE and EE projects and programmes;
- Formulation and implementation of investment programs; and
- Strategic coordination and Programme management at regional and national level.



Objectives of EACREEE

- Overall Objective of EACREEE is to contribute to energy security, energy access and mitigation of negative externalities of the energy system (e.g. local pollution)

Specific objective:

- Create favourable framework conditions for regional RE&EE markets by supporting activities directed at mitigating existing market barriers.



Status of establishing EACREEE

- Feasibility study Completed
- Project document completed and approved by Sectoral Council on Energy
- Establishment of EACREEE approved by the Sectoral Council on Energy
- Makerere University College of Engineering, Design, Art and Technology (CEDAT) designated as a centre of excellence for EACREEE.
- Host country Uganda.



Capacity building in Micro hydro

- Advanced scoping study undertaken
- Study validated and adopted
- Italian government offered 200,000 Euro for 2015 to implement part of the study action plan. It is a 3 year programme
- This activity is to implemented by EACREEE



Clean Energy Programme

- Supported by USAID
- Provided support to develop the 5 year implementation action plan for the Regional Strategy on Scaling Up Access to Modern Energy Services
- Supporting regional projects in terms of planning and knowledge exchange by supporting regional meetings.



Energy and Environment programme (EEP)

- Relevant programme
- All Partner States interested
- Sectoral Council on Energy took note of the progress made by EEP and urged Partner States to provide resources to monitor the projects funded by EEP.
